


  - Test hypotheses
- People skills
- Strong academic background



# Different Types of Disorders (Children and Adults)

  - Swallowing disorders, cleft palate, voice disorders
- Cognitive neuroscience
  - Aphasia from strokes
  - Cognitive communication disorders (brain injury, dementia)

- Passing score on a national exam
- 9 month clinical fellowship

#### Excellent!

- Projected need is strong
  - Openings in all areas of health care as well as schools
  - Critical shortage of Ph.D.s in academic settings
- Factors influencing need
  - Retiring SLPs
  - Aging baby boomers will increase need for services
  - Babies with long term developmental needs



#### Compensation

- Salary or hourly compensation
  - Opportunities for part time, flexible hours
- Early career (4-6 years)
  - \$60,000 (2009 median)
- Experienced
  - \$80,000 (2009 median)
