

## Highlights and Trends: ASHA Counts for Year End 2010

### Constituents -- How many are there? How have the numbers changed?

- ◆ ASHA currently represents **145,481** speech-language pathologists, audiologists, and speech, language, and hearing scientists. Compared to year end 2009 counts (140,039), this number has increased by 5,442 or 3.9%. Of this number, **141,492** are members.
- ◆ There are **358** members without certification, 5 fewer than at year end 2009 (363).
- ◆ In addition, **245** individuals in 41 countries are affiliated with ASHA, three fewer than at year end 2009 (248).
- ◆ **Audiologists.** The number of certified *members* increased from 11,886 to **11,969** between year end 2009 and year end 2010, while certified *nonmembers* decreased from 978 to **968**. Nonmember certificate holders constitute 7.5% of all certified audiologists at year end 2010 compared to 7.6% at year end 2009, 7.8% in 2008, and 8.0% in 2007.
- ◆ **Speech-Language Pathologists.** The number of certified *members* increased from 120,744 to **126,219** between year end 2009 and year end 2010, while certified *nonmembers* decreased from 2,798 to **2,730**. Nonmember certificate holders constitute 2.1% of all certified speech-language pathologists at year end 2010 compared to 2.3% at year end 2009, 2.4% in 2008, and 2.7% in 2007.
- ◆ **Dual Certification.** Individuals holding dual certification decreased from 1,214 at year end 2009 to **1,195** at the end of 2010.
- ◆ **In Process.** At year end 2010, in-process constituents numbered **1,797** compared to 1,808 at year end 2009, and 2,045 at the end of 2008.

### Demographics -- Who are we?

- ◆ **Gender.** Males currently comprise 17.9% of audiologists, 4.1% of speech-language pathologists, and 26.4% of those with dual certification. Overall, the proportion of male ASHA constituents is 5.7% at the end of 2010, slightly less than that in 2009 (5.9%). This decreasing trend appeared in previous years too - e.g. 7.7% in 1999 to 7.2% in 2001, 6.7% in 2003, 6.3% in 2005, 6.1% in 2007, and 5.9% in 2008.
- ◆ **Race and Ethnicity.** Approximately 7.1% of ASHA members, nonmember certificate holders, and international affiliates are members of a racial minority (compared to 27.6% of the U.S. population according to the 2010 Census), including 1.3% who have self identified as multiracial (compared to 2.9% of the U.S. population). Additionally, 3.8% identified their ethnicity as Hispanic or Latino, compared to 16.3% of the U.S. population.
- ◆ **Age.** Approximately 24.7% of ASHA members, nonmember certificate holders, and international affiliates (specifically, 26.7% of audiologists, 24.0% of speech-language pathologists, and 65.6% of those with dual certification) are 55 years old or older.
