The ARTA provides financial support for audiology/hearing science students to attend the ASHA Convention to a) learn more about current research b) network with fellow students and seasoned professionals currently conducting research and c) learn more about academic-research careers. This award consists of a \$500 travel stipend and complimentary ASHA Convention registration.

Award Eligibility (check one):

- Currently enrolled in a clinical doctoral degree program in audiology (e.g., AuD) accredited by the Council on Academic Accreditation in Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology (CAA)
- Currently enrolled in a research doctoral degree program in audiology or hearing science (e.g., PhD)
- Currently conducting a post-doctoral fellowship in audiology or hearing science

The application packet, to be submitted electronically, (scan documents and attach) should consist of the following:

- A completed APPLICATION FORM. Save and submit this document as "**your name**"_ARTA_Application.
- CURRICULUM VITAE detailing research and/or clinical activities. Save and submit this document as "**your name**"_ARTA_CV.
- A LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION for the applicant from a faculty member and/or mentor that addresses the applicant's interest in adding a research component to their career, and their potential for advancing the scientific knowledge base of the discipline. Save and submit this document as "**your name**"_ARTA_Recommendation.
- 2-page ESSAY describing (check one):
 - a) research interests, current and past research experiences (e.g., formal or informal, including thesis, capstone, or dissertation), and any future research goals in audiology or hearing science. Please indicate Research Area of Interest:

 - b) research interests, current and past clinical experiences that have influenced your research interests in audiology or hearing science, and any future research goals in audiology or hearing science. Please indicate Clinical Area of Interest:
