RE: HB 3065

Dear Representative Holvey:

On behalf of the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association (ASHA), I write to support HB 3065, which allows out-of-state applicants seeking an occupational license in Oregon more time to meet Oregon standards if the applicant is already licensed in another state and is seeking to work in the Eastern Oregon Border Economic Development Region.

ASHA is the national professional, scientific, and credentialing association for 223,000 members and affiliates who are audiologists; speech-language pathologists; speech, language, and hearing scientists; audiology and speech-language pathology support personnel; and students. Audiologists specialize in preventing and assessing hearing and balance disorders as well as providing audiologic treatment, including hearing aids. Speech-language pathologists (SLPs) identify, assess, and treat speech, language, swallowing, and cognitive communication disorders. Over 2,300 ASHA members reside in Oregon.¹

ASHA supports HB 3065, which—although limited to the Eastern Oregon Border Economic Development Region—will help address the shortages that the professions of audiology and speech-language pathology are facing in a various work setting, including education and health care. This bill will further assist consumers in receiving much needed treatment to support their daily needs and enhance their quality of life. ASHA also supports the provisions of this bill that allows professional licensing boards to issue a provisional license, or other provisional authorization, to an out-of-state applicant who meets certain requirements.
