6. Did the authors provide a rating or grade of the evidence behind each recommendation or conclusion? If so, how strong was the evidence, and how does that impact its trustworthiness?	
See "Evidence Ratings Used in this Document" and "Recommendations from this Guideline" or "Conclusions from this Systematic Review."	
7. What takeaways can be drawn from the studies' recommendations or conclusions?	
See "Recommendations from this Guideline" or "Conclusions from this Systematic Review."
