- A. **Contributions to Science** (limit 2 pages). Briefly describe up to three of your most significant contributions to science. This section is based on the NIH Supplement to the Common Form Biosketch. The description of each contribution should be no longer than one half page. For each contribution, indicate the following:
- the historical background that frames the scientific problem;
 - the central finding(s);
 - the influence of the finding(s) on the progress of science or the application of those finding(s) to health or technology;
 - and your specific role in the described work.

Figures, tables, or graphics are not allowed. You may provide in-text, parenthetical references for any of the publications listed in your CV that are relevant to the contributions described in this section. Descriptions of contributions may include manuscripts that have not yet been accepted for publication.

- B. **Future Research** (limit 1 page). Provide a roadmap that is accessible to a relatively broad academic audience by describing a clear and succinct picture of your five-year programmatic research goals and strategies, incorporating the following components:
- a. Overarching goals, including the theoretical framework or model to be tested, questions you plan to address, and the significance of your program of research.
 - b. A general experimental or methodological section that provides sufficient detail to demonstrate the nature and innovation behind your overall approach(es) to accomplish your research aims (do not describe individual experiments).
 - c. Brief statement of the relevant funding sources you plan to target.
