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2021 Member and Affiliate Profile

Overall Counts

ASHA currently represents 223,456 members and affiliates: audiologists; speech-language pathologists (SLPs); speech, language, and hearing scientists; audiology and speech-language pathology support personnel; and undergraduate, graduate, and doctoral students in communication sciences and disorders (CSD) who are members of the National Student Speech Language Hearing Association (NSSLHA). ASHA's membership and affiliation grew by 5,142 people in 2021—a 2.4% increase from the previous year.

Counts by Membership or Affiliation Status

- Audiologists, SLPs, and Speech, Language, and Hearing Scientists. Excluding assistants, associates, and National NSSLHA members, ASHA represents 212,534 CSD professionals—up from 207,913 at year-end 2020 (a 2.2% increase).
- Audiologists. ASHA represents 13,910 audiologists—up from 13,727 at year-end 2020 (a 1.3% increase). Most (93.4%) audiologists are certified members.
- Speech-Language Pathologists. ASHA represents 193,799 SLPs—up from 188,143 at year-end 2020 (a 3.0% increase). Most (98.8%) SLPs are certified members.
- Individuals With Dual Certification. ASHA represents 707 individuals who hold certification in both audiology and speech-language pathology—down from 758 at year-end 2020 (a 6.7% decline).
- Individuals With Certification in Process. The number of individuals who have started—but not yet completed—the certification process is 3,721—compared with 4,758 at year-end 2020. The high "in process" number in 2020 was due primarily to the large number of individuals, including National NSSLHA members, who applied for certification prior to a change in certification standards.
- Members Only. Only 354 ASHA members do not hold certification—down slightly from 368 at year-end 2020 (a 3.8% decrease).
- International Affiliates. ASHA represents 541 CSD professionals from 61 countries outside the United States—down slightly from 543 professionals from 60 countries at year-end 2020 (a 0.4% decrease).
- **Certified Assistants.** ASHA represents 446 assistants—23 certified in audiology, 354 certified in speech-language pathology, and 69 who have started—but not yet completed—the Assistants Certification Program.
- Associates. ASHA represents 135 audiology and speech-language pathology support personnel—down substantially from 222 at year-end 2020 (a 39.2% decline). This may be due in part to the Assistants Certification Program that was initiated in 2021 and the sunsetting of the Associates Program slated for December 2022.

• National NSSLHA Members. ASHA represents 10,341 students who are members of National NSSLHA—up from 10,179 at year-end 2020 (a 1.6% increase).

Demographics

- Sex. Overall, most (95.6%) ASHA members and affiliates identify as female—up slightly from 95.5% at year-end 2020. About 13.4% of audiologists, 3.6% of SLPs, and 15.9% of those with dual certification identify as male.
- Race and Ethnicity. About 8.7% of ASHA members and affiliates identify as individuals from underrepresented racial groups. Additionally, about 6.2% of ASHA members and affiliates identify as Hispanic or Latino. In contrast, 38.4% of the U.S. population identify as individuals from underrepresented racial groups; 18.7% identify as Hispanic or Latino (U.S. Census Bureau, 2020).
- Age. ASHA members and affiliates who are age 35–44 make up the largest share of the Association (28.2%), followed by those who are age 34 and younger (28.0%), 45–54 (22.3%), 55–64 (13.1%), and 65 and older (8.4%).

Employment Characteristics

- Employment Status. Overall, most (73.3%) ASHA members and affiliates work full time; 17.0% work part time. Only 1.5% are unemployed and seeking work.
- Primary Employment Facility—Audiologists. Most (74.6%) audiologists work in health care settings, including hospitals and residential and nonresidential health care facilities. Most of the remainder work in either schools (7.7%) or colleges/universities (6.4%).
- Primary Employment Facility—SLPs. More than half (50.9%) of SLPs work in schools. Most of the remainder (39.4%) work in either health care settings, including hospitals and residential and nonresidential health care facilities, or colleges/universities (2.6%).
- Private Practice. About 31.2% of audiologists and 22.4% of SLPs work full or part time in private practice.
- Primary Employment Function. About 78.0% of audiologists and 75.1% of SLPs are clinical service providers.
 Most of the remainder are special education teachers, college/university professors, researchers, administrators, or consultants.
